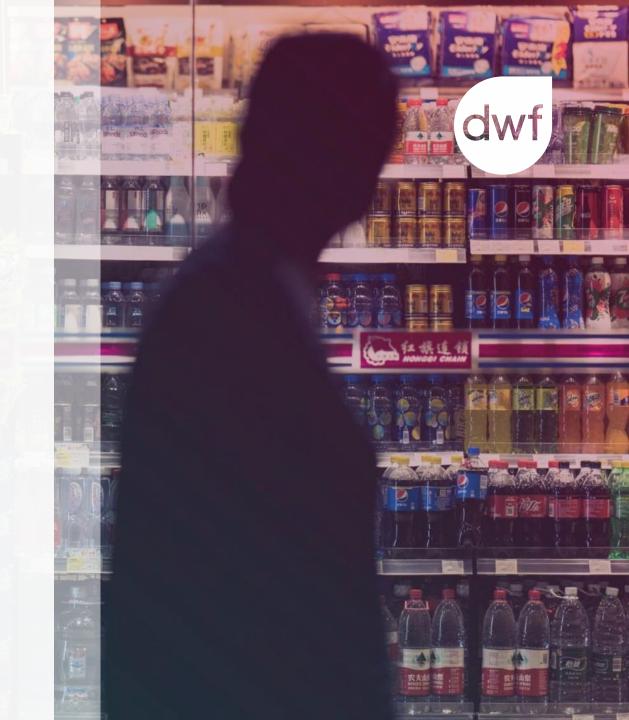
# Consumer Duty Temperature Check

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## Taking the temperature of your plans

There are just 4 months remaining until the deadline for the implementation of the Consumer Duty and the FCA is checking..

The Consumer Duty ("the Duty") applies to all firms that 'have a material influence over, or determine, retail customer outcomes'.

Through recent targeted Dear CEO letters, the FCA has stressed the need to focus on **effective prioritisation**, **embedding the substantive requirements** and **working with other firms**.

This month, the FCA has also issued questionnaires to firms, to gauge the progress towards implementation of the Consumer Duty. This is likely to underpin where the FCA focusses both its industry support for the implementation of the Consumer Duty and also its pre- and post-implementation supervision efforts.

With the next key deadline of 30<sup>th</sup> April little more than a month away, DWF are offering a range of support services to help you achieve the outcomes required under the Duty. Our services are intended to help firms get their Consumer Duty response right first time for the benefit of the business and its customers.

### Areas we will address:

- 1. Whether the firm has correctly identified the scope and application of the Duty of the firm
- 2. Is the firm on track to be able to assess, test, understand and evidence the outcomes their customers are receiving?
- 3. Will the firm be able to deliver good outcomes for customers, with reference to products or service, the characteristics of the firm's customers, the firm's relationship with its customers and the size of the firm?
- 4. How has the firm considered the external environment changing, and how will that impact on the organisation's ability to deliver good outcomes for customers?
- 5. Has the firm considered how its culture supports the delivery of good outcomes for customers?

#### Benefits for the firm

- 1. Confirming whether the firm is on track to meet the applicable deadlines under the Duty
- 2. Being able to answer the FCA's readiness questionnaire with confidence
- 3. Understanding whether the design of your Consumer Duty framework will meet the expectations of the firm under the Duty
- 4. Understanding if the Firm is going to be able to robustly evidence how it will meet the outcomes expected under the Duty
